



**A. James Barnes**

Professor; Professor of Public and Environmental Affairs, and Adjunct Professor of Law at Indiana University in Bloomington's School of Public and Environmental Affairs (SPEA)

Prof. Barnes' teaching interests include environmental law, environmental policy, alternative dispute resolution, business law, and ethics and the public official. He has written, testified, and spoken extensively on environmental issues and mediates environmental disputes.

From 1985 to 2000, he served as Dean of the School of Public and Environmental Affairs. During this time, it was ranked third among public affairs programs by *U.S. News & World Report* and first in environmental policy.

From 1985 to 1988, Prof. Barnes served as the Deputy Administrator of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). From 1983 to 1985, he was the EPA General Counsel, and in the early 1970s, he participated in the formation of EPA and served as the chief of staff to its first Administrator, William D. Ruckelshaus.

Dean Barnes also served as General Counsel of the U.S. Department of Agriculture from 1981 to 1983. For six years, from 1975 to 1981, he had an environmental law, commercial and litigation practice with the firm of Beveridge and Diamond in Washington, D.C.

He currently chairs EPA's Environmental Finance Advisory Board and is a fellow in the National Academy of Public Administration. From 1992-1998 he was on the board of the Long Island Lighting Company (LILCo).
