DOE ISSUES REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS TO PROVIDE SECURITY SERVICES FOR SAVANNAH RIVER SITE

CINCINNATI - The U.S. Department of Energy's Environmental Management Consolidated Business Center (EMCBC) today issued a Request for Proposals (RFP) for the procurement of protective force security services at DOE's Savannah River Site (SRS) in Aiken, South Carolina. The contract is a cost-plus award-fee contract valued at approximately \$100-\$150 M a year for up to 10 years (a five-year base period with options to extend up to another five years).

Work similar to the services described above is currently being performed by the incumbent contractor, Wackenhut Services, Inc. A modification to the current contract due to expire September 30, 2008, has been executed to allow DOE to extend the period of performance by up to 15 months.

The services to be provided include protection of government-owned or leased property and material, Special Nuclear Material, classified and sensitive information, vital facilities, support facilities, government and other employees and visitors for the SRS.

The SRS is a 310-square mile DOE industrial facility located in Aiken, Allendale, and Barnwell Counties in South Carolina. SRS is dedicated to environmental management cleanup, developing and deploying technologies to support the cleanup mission, providing capability for supporting the enduring nuclear weapons stockpile, and processing and storing nuclear materials in support of U.S. nuclear non-proliferation efforts.

DOE's Office of Environmental Management (EM) is the landlord for the SRS and is responsible for cleanup missions and for the Savannah River National Laboratory. The National Nuclear Security Administration (NNSA), a semi-autonomous agency within DOE, is responsible for supporting the nuclear weapons stockpile programs and nonproliferation activities at SRS.
